- 1. Mailing must be sent under the frank
- Must concern the views of or otherwise relate to the Senator
- **3.** Mass mailing contains no gratuitous biographical information

SERVICE ACADEMY NOMINATIONS

Senator Schatz has the privilege of nominating exceptional students from the state of Hawai'i for appointment to the U.S. Service Academies. An official nomination is required

for admission to each Academy except the U.S. Coast

Students will be evaluated on a broad range of criteria including

character, scholarship, and leadership. Due to a competitive and thorough selection process, students are encouraged to begin their applications to their Congressional sponsors and

HIGH SCHOOL INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Senator Schatz's high school internship program encourages students to be advocates in their schools and communities. Previous classes have conducted surveys, attended community

meetings, tracked how federal legislation impacts their communities, and drafted memos for the office.

Students must commit from October – April, and strong preference is given to those in their last year of school. **This is a virtual internship**, so students from all islands are encouraged to apply.
