Mass Mailing

1. Mailing must be sent under the frank
2. Must concern the views of or otherwise relate to the Senator
3. Mass mailing contains no gratuitous biographical information
4. Photos of the Senator pictured with others may be no larger than 20-square inches (e.g., 4" x 5")
5. Mailing must contain the phrase **"PREPARED, PUBLISHED, AND MAILED AT TAXPAYER EXPENSE"** in 7 point or larger font at the bottom of the first page

Senator's name, except in the masthead, may not have a type larger than 1/4 of an inch in height

Photos of the Senator alone may be no larger than 12 - square inches (e.g., 3" x 4")

HIGH SCHOOL INTERNSHIP PROGRAM

Senator Schatz's high school internship program encourages students to be advocates in their schools and communities. Previous classes have conducted surveys, attended community meetings, tracked how federal legislation impacts their communities, and drafted memos for the office. Students must commit from October - April, and strong preference is given to those in their last year of school. **This is a virtual internship**, so students from all islands are encouraged to apply.

UNDERGRADUATE, GRADUATE, AND LAW SCHOOL INTERNSHIPS

Senator Schatz offers internship positions year-round in both his Hawai'i and Washington, D.C. offices. Applicants must have completed at least a full year of college and should be strong writers with a positive attitude and excellent communications skills. Undergraduate, graduate, and law student internships in Senator Schatz's office are paid unless in conflict with degree requirements or other unique circumstances. Students should apply early as there are a limited number of positions in each office.
